



Father Frank Pavone. *Consistent.*

"Human problems demand humane solutions, and killing is not one of them."

Perhaps no one has been a stronger national pro-life advocate than Father Frank Pavone. He has tirelessly and passionately advanced the cause of protecting the unborn.

Originally from New York, Fr. Pavone was ordained in 1988. With permission from his bishop, he serves as a full-time advocate for life issues. In 1993 Fr. Pavone became National Director of Priests for Life. He is also the President of the National Pro-life Religious Council, and the National Pastoral Director of the Silent No More Awareness Campaign and of Rachel's Vineyard, the world's largest ministry of healing after abortion.

Born in 1959 in Port Chester, New York, Fr. Pavone aspired to be an astronaut as a child but decided to become a priest after volunteering at his parish. After attending the 1976 March for Life, Fr. Pavone devoted his life to the pro-life cause. After graduating as valedictorian of his high school class, he enrolled in Don Bosco College, a Salesian Major Seminary in Newton, New Jersey, later joining the Archdiocese of New York.

Fr. Pavone travels extensively throughout the United States, preaching and teaching against abortion. He was asked by Mother Teresa to speak in India on life issues, and has addressed the pro-life caucus of the United States House of Representatives. The Vatican appointed him to the Pontifical Council for the Family, which coordinates the pro-life activities of the Catholic Church.

While the focus of his ministry is eliminating abortion, he is plainspoken in his embrace of a consistent life ethic.

"Too often our Church suffers from a gap between the anti-war, anti-death penalty stand and the anti-abortion stand. At the center of the Christian way of life is the dignity of the human person, and that dignity knows no boundary at the womb any more than it does at the prison or the battlefield."

Father Pavone received the "Proudly Pro-life Award" by the National Right to Life Committee, and numerous other pro-life awards and honorary doctorates. He is the author of two books, *Ending Abortion, Not Just Fighting It*, and *Pro-life Reflections for Every Day*. Norma McCorvey, the "Jane Roe" of the Supreme Court's Roe vs. Wade abortion decision, called Fr. Frank "the catalyst that brought me into the Catholic Church."

Father Frank is consistent. Will you join him in protecting all life?
